Introduction

Web Browser: A program that allows you to view websites and navigate between them using hyperlinks



Common Browsers










Search Engine: A website that allows you to look up information and view content on the internet



Common Search Engines









- Opening a Web Browser:
 - Desktop Shortcut
 - Menu Bar










 Address Bar: Use this to type in the address of a website or web page.




• **Search Box:** Use this to enter keywords when the exact address is unknown.




Note: Some browsers only have a single "omnibox" that is used to enter both web addresses and keywords (like Google).


Browser Window: This is how you view and navigate web pages.
 Within a browser window, you can have multiple tabs. You can also have multiple browser windows open at the same time.




 Tabs: Use these to open a web page without closing the current one so you can navigate back and forth between them. To open a new tab, click the + sign.




- Back: Use this to return to the previous screen in the web browser.
- Forward: Use this to return to the screen that appeared before you hit the back button in the web browser.




• **Stop:** Use this to stop a web page from loading when it's taking too long or you realize you selected the wrong web page.




• **Reload** or **Refresh:** Use this to reload the web page to ensure the page content is up to date.



Home: Use this to return to the homepage of the web browser.
 You can select which web page you want to set as your homepage in the web browser's settings.



 Bookmarks or Favorites: Use this to save favorite or frequently visited web pages so they are easier to find later.









• Searching the web: Use this search box to type your search terms.




• **Search Recommendations:** When you begin to type in your search, the search engine will recommend relevant search terms.




Search Term




Search Results: A list of items that match the search terms.



 Hyperlink (also known as a link): It is an element on the web page that when clicked takes you to another document on the internet.

• **Related Searches** or **Also Try:** The search engine recommends similar searches you may want to try. To execute the search, click the search term.


 Additional Results: These links show other web pages that relate to your search. Clicking Next or the right arrow takes you to the next page. You can go to a specific page of results by clicking the page number.




 Ads in Search Results: Search engines sometimes display advertisements related to the search result.




Search by Format Type



Search by Format Type Example





Search Tips & Tricks



- Use quotation marks to search for an exact phrase.
 Example: "Illinois State Fair"
- AND narrows your search results. It finds web pages that contain all the search terms.

Example: Chicago **AND** events

• OR expands your search. It finds web pages that contain either word.


Example: college **OR** university


You can exclude terms from the search results by using the (-) minus symbol.

Example: cardinal -baseball

Search Tips & Tricks


- Review the search results list before clicking a link.
- Check multiple pages before using a new keyword search.
- Use "Also try" or "Searches related to."
- If you can't find a web page, try using the recommended searches feature available on most search result pages.






 Website: A collection of web pages that provide information about a particular business, group, organization, or person (such as the Salt Lake City Public Library).




• **Navigation Menu:** A collection of links to the main sections of the website. Navigation menus usually appear near the top of the page. Click these links to browse other sections of the website.



Navigation Menu: Main section hyperlink




• **Search Box:** Just like a search engine searches the internet, the search box on a website allows visitors to search for specific information on the site they are visiting.




 Main Content: This is the big area in the middle of the web page that contains most of the information. Examples: a story you want to read, a video you want to watch, a recipe you want to bake, etc.



 Footer: A collection of links that appears on the bottom of each page. The footer often includes basic information about the website or company, including contact information, terms of use, social media links, and more.



• **Sidebar Navigation:** This is collection of links that allows the user to navigate to information in a particular section of the website.



Tips & Tricks

- **Safety Tips:** Here are some tips to ensure that you use the internet safely.
 - Secure websites: These usually begin with https:// or show a lock icon or message to alert users that the website owner employs their own security team to ensure encryption of the user's information.



- Fake URLs: Sometimes fraudsters create a fake URL as part of an online scam. Check the website address or URL to make sure you are on the website you intended to visit. A missing letter, a typo, or grammatical errors can be a sign that the website may be part of a scam.
- Security settings: Check the security settings in your web browser to view and set your security preferences.
